

Guantanamo Bay could be closed down

The Bush administration is debating a proposal to close its Guantanamo Bay detainee facility in Cuba and move prisoners there to military prisons elsewhere in the U.S. The camp currently holds about 375 men on suspicion of terrorism or links to al-Qaeda or the Taliban

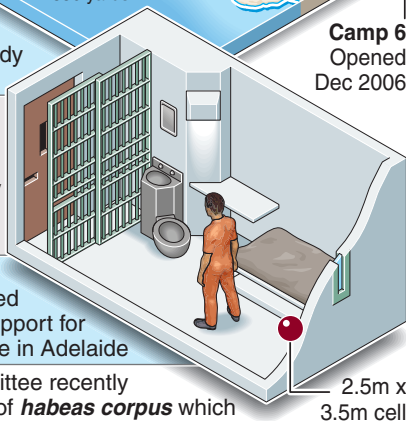
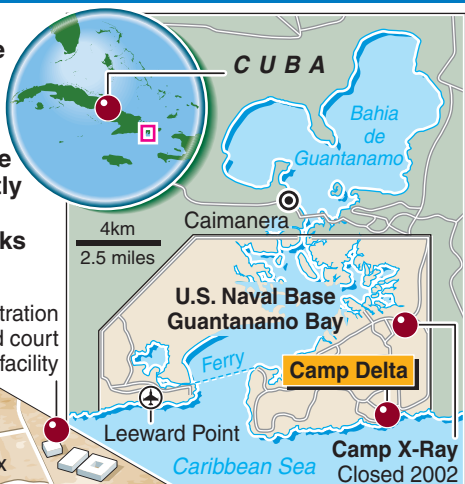
■ **2002-07:** About 780 *"enemy combatants"* have been held – mostly without charge. Four committed suicide. About 405 transferred to custody of their native countries

■ **Charges:** *Only three charged with crimes under military trial system.* Two of those saw their charges thrown out by military judges who said military had failed to demonstrate detainees were *"unlawful"* combatants

■ **Convictions to date:** *Just one.* Australian detainee David Hicks pleaded guilty in March to providing material support for terrorism. Serving nine-month sentence in Adelaide

■ **Congress:** Senate Judiciary Committee recently backed a bipartisan bill to restore writ of *habeas corpus* which protects an individual against unlawful and indefinite imprisonment
