The next president of Russia will probably be elected from the so-called St Petersburg clan – an elite group of Vladimir Putin's ex-colleagues at the Federal Security Service (FSB) who control the Kremlin, government, the media, large parts of the economy, the military and security forces



Dmitry Medvedey, 41: Putin protegé and joint first deputy prime minister. The St Petersburg lawyer is widely seen as representing Kremlin's more liberal-technocrat forces. Responsible for health, education, housing and agriculture, Medvedev is also chairman of state-controlled Gazprom Sergei Ivanov, 54: Former

KGB colonel and defence minister, promoted to joint first deputy prime minister in February, Hardliner Ivanov has support of siloviki powerful former armv-KGB officers who control top Kremlin positions
