Lebanon's opposition politicians are expected to continuue to boycott parliament - denying the ruling coalition the necessary two-thirds quorum required to appoint their successor to President Émile Lahoud until a consensus candidate is found

Nassib Lahoud: Well respected former MP and Ambassador to U.S. Widely supported by intelligentsia



Boutros Harb Former MP with six-year plan to unite factions. Calls for dialogue

OPPOSITION

Michel Aoun: Former general and one-time prime minister. driven into exile by Syria in 1990 but now aligned with Damascus



Robert Ghanem MP retained seat in 2005. uniquely with support from both sides of equals of parliament with Syria



If neither side is able to command a sufficient majority, either a middle-ground candidate must be agreed, or President could appoint Army chief Michel Suleiman head of interim cabinet to stop government taking executive powers

COMPROMISE CANDIDATES



Riad Salameh: Central Bank governor since 1992, credited with stabilising economy despite war and political crises



General Michel Suleiman Has maintained Army neutrality and led popular fight against Islamists at refugee camp



Jean Obeid: Former advisor to Presidents Sarkis and Gemayel. Close to late Svrian President Hafez al-Assad and murdered Lebanese PM Rafik Hariri
