

Trade links with Myanmar

Bilateral trade with Myanmar topped \$9 billion in 2006 – the most since the current military junta seized power in 1988. Trade with China has climbed nearly 50% in the first eight months of this year with most of that in natural gas deals



France: Oil giant *Total* operates *Yadana* gas field – output in 2006 averaged 19.3m cubic metres per day.

Alcatel is Myanmar's only mobile service provider



United States: *Chevron* subsidiary *Unocal* is partner in *Yadana* project

UK: Between 1988 and 2004, British companies invested £1.2bn in Burma. *Premier Oil* and *BAT* pulled out in 2002-03

China: Involved in 40 hydropower projects and 17 onshore and offshore oil-and-gas projects. Plan to build a 2,400km, \$1 billion, oil-and-gas pipeline from Arakan to China's Yunnan province



South Korea: *Daewoo* is main investor in *Shwe* gas field – net profit could top \$100m a year

Singapore: *Keppel Corporation* owns *Sedona* Hotels in Yangon and Mandalay



Japan:

Suzuki owns 60% of Myanmar's car maker *MADEI*.

Nippon Oil is partner with *Petronas* in *Yetagun* field
