
Militants had vowed attacks on Bhutto

■ Baitullah Mehsud: Pakistani Taliban commander threatened that his suicide bombers from south Waziristan-based *Mehsud tribe* would kill Bhutto

■ Masood Azhar: Leader of Al Qaedalinked Jaish-e-Mohammed. Azhar is strong supporter of Afghan Taliban leader Mullah Mohammed Omar

■ Laskar-e-Tayyaba: Al Qaeda-linked group trains suicide bombers in tribal areas for attacks on U.S. and NATO troops in Afghanistan
