Cristina - from first lady to president

Argentina's first lady is almost certain to win Sunday's contest to succeed her husband, Nestor Kirchner, as president, crowning the so-called "Clintons of the South" as Latin America's ultimate power couple



■ Cristina Fernandez de Kirchner:
Born February 19, 1953. Meets her future husband, *Nestor Kirchner*, while studying law at University of La Plata. They marry in 1975, and have two children, *Maximo* and *Florencia*

Political career: Elected in 1995 to represent Santa Cruz in *Senate*, and in 1997 to *Chamber of Deputies*. In 2001 she wins Senate seat again

Nestor Kirchner: Elected Mayor of Rio Gallegos in 1987. Becomes Governor of Santa Cruz in 1991 at age 41. Elected Argentine President in 2003 – guides nation's economic recovery with Fernandez as a key advisor. He looks forward to becoming country's "first gentleman"



Born October 26, 1947.
Meets future husband *Bill Clinton* while studying at Yale
Law School. They marry in 1975, only child, *Chelsea*, born in 1980

Political career: Member of impeachment inquiry during Watergate scandal. Elected to U.S. Senate in 2000 to represent New York

Bill Clinton: Attorney General of Arkansas from 1977, elected Governor of Arkansas in 1978 at age 32. When elected U.S. President in 1992, Hillary becomes his top advisor. Cheerleader-in-chief for his wife's election bid – jokes about becoming America's "first laddie"
