## **Commonwealth suspensions**

Pakistan has been suspended from the Commonwealth for the second time in eight years, citing President Pervez Musharraf's failure to lift a state of emergency as a violation of the group's fundamental political values. The 53-nation Commonwealth represents nearly two billion citizens
