Life and times of Benazir Bhutto

- Jun 21, 1953:
 Benazir Bhutto born
 in Karachi, Pakistan
- ◆ 1969: Gains degree from Harvard in U.S.
- ◆ 1973: Her father, Zulfikar Ali Bhutto, founder of Pakistan People's Party (PPP), becomes prime minister
- second degree at
 Oxford University,
 England. Days after
 returning to Pakistan
 General *Zia-ul-Haq*ousts her father and seizes power

1977: Awarded

- ◆ 1979: Zulfikar Ali Bhutto executed by Zia military government
- 1979-84: Arrested several times for anti-Zia protests, placed under house arrest for three years
- 1984: Allowed to return to London, she becomes leader in exile of PPP. Campaigns against Zia dictatorship
- 1985: Martial law lifted in Pakistan
 1986: Bhutto greeted by thousands when she returns to Pakistan, elected co-chairwoman, with her mother, of PPP Pakistan's largest political party
- ◆ 1988: Becomes first woman elected as prime minister of an Islamic country
 - ◆ 1990: Dismissed from office for alleged corruption

- ◆ 1993: Re-elected as PM but faces fierce opposition from Islamic groups. Her husband, *Asif Ali Zardari*, charged with corruption
- 1996: Dismissed from office on alleged corruption charges
- ◆ 1997: Husband imprisoned. Bhutto returns to UK in self-imposed exile
- ◆ 1999: Army chief General *Pervez Musharraf* takes power in bloodless coup
- 2001: Pakistani court sentences Bhutto to three years in jail for failing to appear to face corruption charges
- ◆ 2004: Swiss court gives Bhutto and her husband six-month suspended jail terms for money-laundering
- Oct 2007: Ms Bhutto returns to Pakistan ahead of elections. President Musharraf grants her immunity from corruption charges
 - Oct 19: Survives assassination attack in southern city of Karachi when suicide bomber kills nearly 150 people
 - Dec 27: Benazir Bhutto is assassinated in gun and suicide bomb attack as she leaves election rally in city of Rawalpindi. At least 15 others are killed in attack
