
Building the world's cheapest car

The cheapest new car in the world, set to sell for just \$2,500, has been unveiled at the Delhi Auto Expo by the Indian motor manufacturer Tata Motors. Named the Nano, the car is aimed at the country's 65 million scooter riders currently unable to afford a car



Rear wheel drive:

Uses continuous variable transmission, lighter alternative to manual or automatic

Cost saving:

Radio, air conditioning are optional extras. No power steering, emissions control, antilock brakes, air bags, safety beams

Wheel bearings:

Strong enough to drive car at 45mph, but will quickly wear out at higher speeds
