This will make little difference to World Champion Kimi Raikkonen, but he will still require Technical Director Aldo Costa's F2008 to deliver. The fact that it appears to be an evolution rather than a revolution could hold it back if rival teams make major steps

BMW SAUBER F1 TEAM

BMW Sauber F1.08 Mario Theissen wants results and the F1.08 could deliver the team's intel

In contrast to Ferrari's conservative approach, BMW Sauber is aggressive in its bid for wins. The F1.08 is Chief Designer Christoph Zimmerman's chance to shine since taking over from Jorg Zander, with aerodynamicist Mariano Alperin-Bruvera producing a greatly different nose to land the stability that tech chief Willy Rampf demands now that traction control has been banned

RENAULT F1 TEAM

Fernando Alonso Spain. Age 26. 105 starts. 19 wins **Nelson Piquet Jnr** Brazil. Age 23. 0 starts Best result: n/a

Renault R28 Alonso is back, but he will have his work cut out to take Renault back to the front

Technical Director Pat Symonds admitted Renault went off the boil in 2007 after underestimating the aerodynamic effect of changing from Michelin to Bridgestone tyres. The team is now hoping the revised shape of the R28 with its zero keel will take it back to the top. Alonso has noted the car is still a second off the pace, suggesting rapid progress is required to deliver a third title



Nico Rosberg Germany Age 22. 25 starts. Best result: 4th Kazuki Nakajima Japan. Age 23. 1 start. Best result: 10th

Williams FW30 Fine-tuning is the key to the FW30 as Williams aims to rejoin the top teams

One of tech chief Sam Michael's primary targets is a less fragile car. Chief designer Ed Wood and aerodynamicist Jon Tomlinson are responsible for the FW30, seen as a development of the FW29, with a triple-plane front wing marking a change of direction. Nico Hulkenberg brings speed to the test driver's role, but Alex Wurz's expertise will be missed in sorting the car

Red Bull RB4 Last year's poor reliability must be sorted to rean the fruits of Adrian Newey's

The cerebral combination of Adrian Newey and Geoff Willis worked famously when they were together at Williams, and Red Bull Racing will be hoping that it can strike gold too. The RB4 doesn't look that different to the RB3, but detail changes include a new gearbox, rear suspension and diffuser, while improved reliability is sought through Willis tidying up the engineering side

PANASONIC TOYOTA RACING

Jarno Trulli Italy. Age 33. 184 starts. 1 win **Timo Glock** Germany. Age 25 4 starts. Best result: 7th

Toyota TF108 In its seventh F1 season, Toyota must make solid progress after years of mediocrity

Technical overlord Pascal Vasselon and aerodynamics chief Mark Gillan are confident that the TF108 will be more aerodynamically efficient. Like McLaren, they have opted for a longer wheelbase in their quest for more predictable handling, but Jarno Trulli and newcomer Timo Glock need to be able to deliver to keep the automotive giant's senior management happy

SCUDERIA TORO ROSSO

Toro Rosso STR2 Strong form late in 2007 saw Toro Rosso head the midfield. Can they stay there?

The team will have to wait until the European rounds for its version of the 2008 Red Bull RB4 and make do with an updated version of its STR2 in the meantime. But the car's point-scoring form in last year's late-season races suggests that might not be such a bad option until the drivers get their hands on the latest creation from the creative mind of Adrian Newey

HONDA RACING F1 TEAM

Jenson Button England. Age 28. 136 starts. 1 win Rubens **Barrichello** Brazil. Age 35. 250 starts 9 wins

Honda RA108 After a disastrous 2007 this is truly a make-or-break year for Nick Fry

The RA108 looks different from its predecessor and everyone in the team will be hoping that it goes better too. The first Honda designed by Jorg Zander (ex-BMW Sauber) and Loic Bigois (ex-Williams) appears slimmer than its troublesome forerunner and will hopefully be less sensitive to pitch and roll. Combine this with Ross Brawn's input, and the drivers ought to have reason to smile

SUPER AGURI F1 TFAM Takuma Sato Japan. Age 30. 87 starts. Best result: 3rd **Anthony Davidson** England. Age 28. 20 starts. Best result: 11th

Beat mentor Honda on occasion in 2007 Super Aguri SA08 despite difficult finances. 2008 will be tougher SAMANTHA KIN

Taking on Honda's pitch-sensitive 2007 chassis that was such a handful under braking, former racer Aguri Suzuki's team will be cheered by the fact that it will sport the late-season aerodynamic modifications - such as the larger bargeboards - that improved Honda's results. Money remained tight through the close-season, with a number of groups formulating a take-over



Force India VJM01 A new name for the team that was once Jordan, but don't expect an instant

Mike Gascoyne remains one of the shrewdest technical chiefs around but a lack of budget until late last year, when Vijay Mallya bought the team, means that the development work for this year's Ferrari-powered car is not as comprehensive as it should have been. However, technical advances introduced through the course of the season ought to help it advance towards the midfield



Lewis Hamilton England. Age 22. 17 starts. 4 wins Heikki Kovalainen Finland. Age 26. 17 starts Best result: 2nd



The MP4-23 had better be good, because Paddy Lowe, Neal Oatley and aerodynamicist Simon Lacey need to expunge the after-taste of last year's spying scandal. A longer wheelbase has been adopted to counter the advantage Ferrari enjoyed last year on the faster circuits, while the nose is higher and the rear half of the car has been slimmed down as much as possible
