A wave of attacks blamed on Taliban- and Al Qaedalinked militants have left at least 300 people dead across Pakistan in the run-up to parliamentary elections. Opposition parties loval to the late Benazir Bhutto and former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif appear poised for a landslide victory as public support for President Pervez Musharraf (right) plunges to an all-time low


