

Tibet clashes spread to adjacent provinces

Tibet's government-in-exile has raised its confirmed death toll from clashes between Chinese authorities and Tibetan protesters to 99 as protests spread from Lhasa to the surrounding provinces of Qinghai, Gansu and Sichuan. The Dalai Lama threatened to resign as leader of Tibet's exiles if unrest in his Himalayan homeland worsened

Lhasa, Tuesday: Chinese Army parades dozens of Tibetan prisoners in handcuffs, their heads bowed.

Saturday: As many as 80 people reported killed by riot police

Machu, Tuesday: 19 Tibetans killed in fresh protests

Lithang, Monday: Troops backed by tanks stop protests

Kirti monastery, Ngaba, Sunday: Security forces kill 8-13 protestors

Aba, Sunday: Police fire on 1,000 monks and protestors, 7-18 killed

Labrang monastery, Xiahe, Saturday: Four monks shot dead
