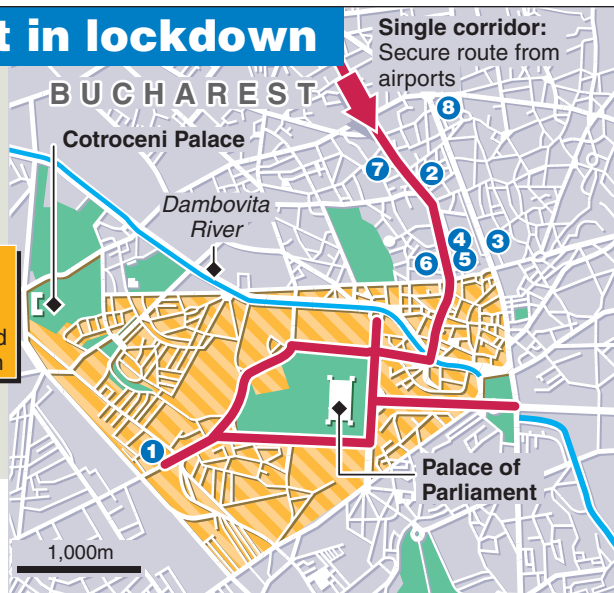
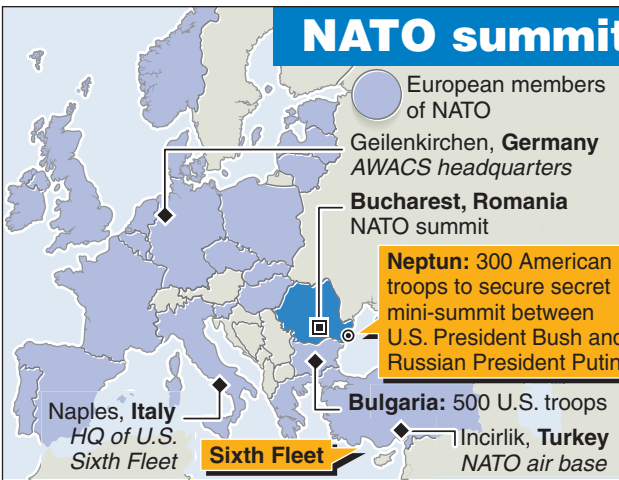


# NATO summit in lockdown

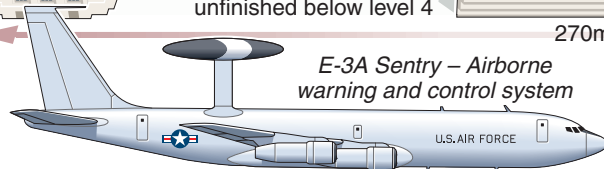
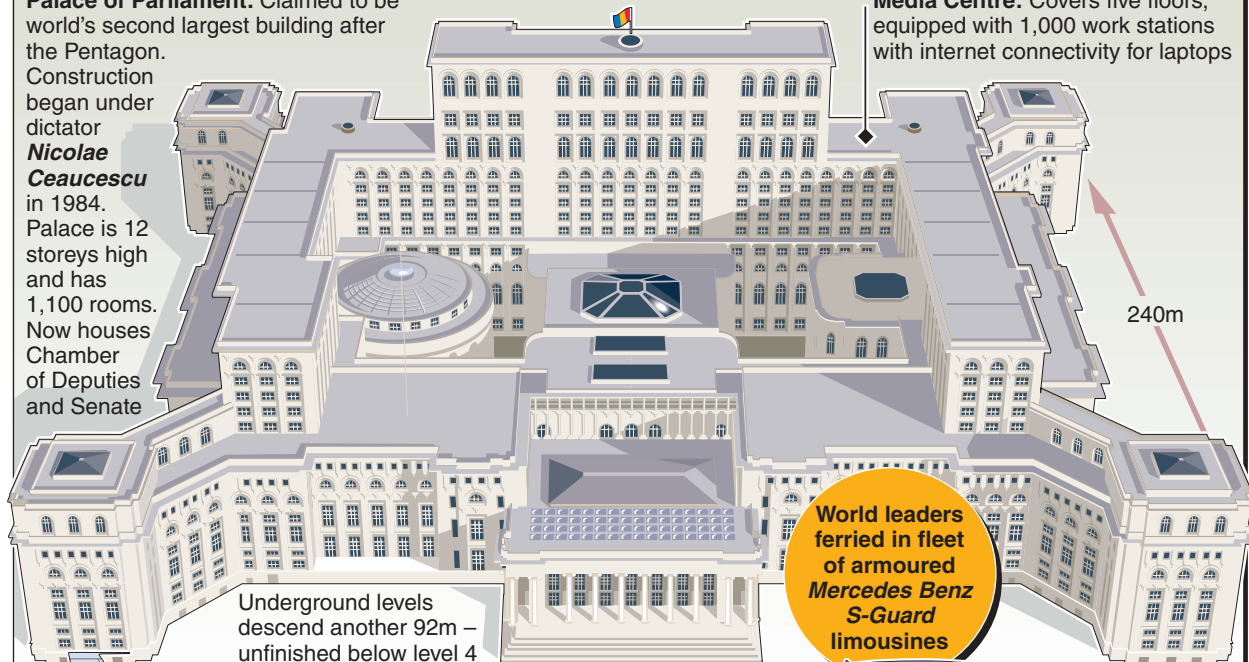


14 hotels to accommodate 3,000 delegates, including 24 heads of state, 26 prime ministers and 87 ministers

1. **Marriot:** *President Bush* and 1,000-strong U.S. team.
2. **Hilton:** *Chancellor Angela Merkel* plus 100-member German delegation.

**Palace of Parliament:** Claimed to be world's second largest building after the Pentagon. Construction began under dictator **Nicolae Ceausescu** in 1984. Palace is 12 storeys high and has 1,100 rooms. Now houses Chamber of Deputies and Senate

**Media Centre:** Covers five floors, equipped with 1,000 work stations with internet connectivity for laptops



**NATO AWACS:** Fleet of 17 E-3As based in Germany. AWACS will search for hijacked airliners, other suspicious aircraft, and intercept hostile communications. **23,000 Romanian security personnel assigned to protect delegates**
