

- Mar 10, 1952: Morgan Richard Tsvangirai born in Gutu, Southern Rhodesia, eldest son of a bricklayer
- 1968: Leaves school with no qualifications, works in textile factory
- 1974-84: Works in nickel mine, rising to post of general foreman
- 1988: As leader of *Zimbabwe*Congress of Trade Unions, he
 breaks ranks with *President Robert*Mugabe's ZANU-PF party
- 1997: Leads so-called stay-away strikes which force Mugabe to cancel proposed income tax increases
- 1999: Helps found labour-backed Movement for Democratic Change
- Feb 2000: MDC defeats government referendum on reform bill permitting seizure of white-owned farms without compensation
- Jun: MDC inflicts surprise blow against Mugabe by winning 57 of 120 seats in parliamentary election
- 2002: Presidential election bid fails
- 2007: Arrested and beaten by police for taking part in illegal prayer meeting. Pictures of his injuries draw international condemnation
