Nov 7, 1952: Born in Cornwall on Hudson, New York, to Dutch American parents

- Education: Top graduate from U.S. Command and General Staff College, 1983; doctorate from Princeton, 1987 Career −1970s-80s: Commissioned
- Career –1970s-80s: Commissioned as infantry officer, promoted up command ladder to lieutenant colonel
 1990s: Commands 101st Airborne
- Division. Assigned to UN Mission in Haiti, 82nd Airborne Division, then Pentagon as Executive Assistant to Chairman of Joint Chiefs

 2001: Serves as brigadier general,
- working on counter-terrorism task force in Bosnia following 9/11 attacks

 2003: Leads 101st Airborne through
- 2004: Promoted to lieutenant general – trains Iraqi security forces
 Jan 2007: Appointed commander
