Aid offers mount for cylone-hit Myanmar

The international community has pledged more than \$10 million worth of aid and technical support to Myanmar (Burma) following the destruction wreaked by Cyclone Nargis which killed more than 22,000 people



- Canada: Some \$2 million to support relief efforts by UN and International Red Cross
- China: \$500,000 plus tents, blankets and food worth \$500,000
- European Union: \$3 million pledged for humanitarian aid Germany: Some \$775,000 to
- German aid organisations to provide shelter, drinking water and other aid
- Greece: \$300,000 plus relief aid India: Navy sending two ships
- loaded with food, medicines, tents, clothing and blankets
- Indonesia: \$1 million plus food, medicine and other aid
- Japan: \$267,600 worth of emergency aid including tents and power generators
- Norway: \$1.95 million to be used for emergency aid

- Singapore: \$200,000 in aid plus rescue and medical teams
- Switzerland: \$476,000 pledged
- Thailand: Transport plane loaded with food and medicine
- United States: \$250,000 in aid plus offer of help from U.S. Navy currently off east coast of Thailand if Myanmar junta makes formal request

Non-governmental aid offers

- American Red Cross: \$100,000 pledged in funds and supplies
- Swiss Red Cross: Some \$189,000 released for drinking water, clothing, food, plastic sheeting and hygiene kits
- United Nations: Disaster assessment team sent to Bangkok. UNICEF teams in Myanmar
- World Vision: Christian relief group has pledged \$3 million, assessment teams deployed to hardest-hit areas
