

Rival Lebanese leaders have agreed a deal which paves the way to elect army chief General Michel

Suleiman as president

- **Born:** Nov 1, 1948, in Amchit, to Maronite Catholic family
- 1998: Syrian-sponsored appointment as Army Commander
- 2005: Refused to use military to end street demonstrations of Cedar Revolution following assassination of former Prime Minister Rafik Hariri. forcing Syria to withdraw its troops
- 2006: Distanced Army from Hezbollah during 34-day war with Israel - subsequently deployed military to re-establish Lebanese sovereignty in south of country
- Jan 2007: Imposed curfew to guell Sunni-Shiite clashes in Beirut Jun-Sep: Won widespread praise for tackling and eventually defeating Fatah al-Islam militants in siege of Nahr al-Bared refugee camp
