

"Butcher of Bosnia" faces UN tribunal

Radovan Karadzic, accused of war crimes including masterminding Europe's worst massacre since the second world war, is facing extradition to the UN court in The Hague, where 161 people have been indicted for violations of international humanitarian law in the former Yugoslavia

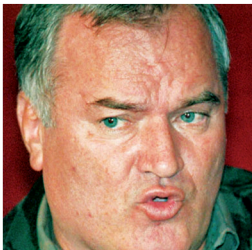

Radovan Karadzic, 63

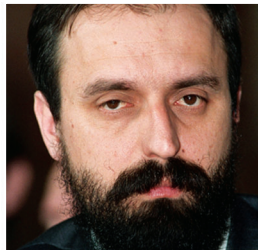
Bosnian Serb President during 1992-95 Bosnia war. Twice indicted for genocide, for 43-month siege of Sarajevo and Srebrenica massacre in which 7,500 Muslim men and boys died

REMAINING FUGITIVES



Ratko Mladic, 65

Military leader of Bosnian Serbs, also indicted on genocide charges for siege of Sarajevo in which around 12,000 people were killed, and for Srebrenica massacre



Goran Hadzic, 49

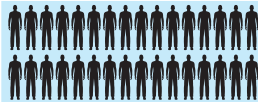
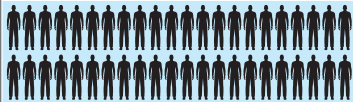
Former leader of rebel Croatian Serbs, indicted for planning murder and deportations of hundreds of non-Serbs in self-declared Republic of Serbian Krajina in Croatia
