Izz Al-Din Al Qassam Brigades: 10,000-strong force commanded by **Ahmad Ja'abri**. Also has access to 6,000 members of **Executive Force** (police) plus some 3,000 militants

Gaza force restructured as a conventional army

Six brigades each divided into...

Four-five battalions

Four-five companies

Three platoons

Three combat teams of eight fighters each

RPG-7 Rocket-propelled grenade

BRDM-2 Armoured patrol vehicle

Anti-aircraft guns 14.5mm and 12.7mm

AT3-Sagger Wire-guided anti-tank missile
Range: 3,000m

Israel's foes re-arming

Iranian- and Syrian-backed terrorist groups Hamas and Hezbollah are engaged in the most significant military build-up in their history. The two groups – which can jointly field an estimated 33,000 fighters – have been armed with more powerful weapons, especially longer-range rockets

HEZBOLLAH

Zelzal Around 450 Iranian-made 600mm rockets, range 250km

Hezbollah has rebuilt its military infrastructure since its 2006 conflict with Israel

Strength: 4,000 regular personnel, 10,000 reservists

Medium-range rockets 2,000 Iranian-made Fajr-3, Fajr-5 and Syrian-made 220mm and 302mm missiles

C-802 Radar-guided anti-ship missile, range 120km

Short-range rockets Estimated 20,000 rockets hidden south of Litani River
