Georgia-Russia conflict timeline



- Aug 4: Russia accuses Georgian President *Mikhail Saakashvili* (*left*) of ethnic cleansing in breakaway South Ossetia, claiming attacks by Georgian army against Moscow-backed rebels
- Aug 7: Truce with rebels breaks down – Georgian troops launch surprise attack on regional capital Tskhinvali
- Aug 9: Georgian parliament approves presidential decree declaring state of war. Russian planes attack military targets in central town of Gori
- Aug 10: Georgia says it has ordered its troops to begin ceasefire, that its forces have withdrawn from South Ossetia. Russia launches bombing raids near Georgian capital Tbilisi



- Aug 11: Russian troops move from Abkhazia and South Ossetia deep into Georgian territory, seizing key towns of Zugdidi, Senaki and Gori, plus strategic east-west road. Tbilisi is effectively cut off from western Black Sea coast
- Aug 12: Russian President *Dmitry Medvedev* (*right*) orders end to fighting.
