Pakistan's Musharraf steps down

President Pervez Musharraf, who has dominated Pakistan since seizing power in a 1999 military coup, has announced his resignation in the face of an impending impeachment motion by the ruling coalition government

- 1999: Musharraf overthrows Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif
- 2001. Jun: Names himself president while remaining head of army
- Sep: Allies Pakistan with U.S. after 9/11 attacks
- controversial referendum on extending his rule for five more years

2002: Wins

- 2003: Escapes two al-Qaeda inspired assassination attempts
- 2004: Reneges on earlier promise to resign as army chief
- 2007, Mar: Musharraf sacks Chief Justice Iftikhar Chaudhry, triggering protests across country
- Jul: Security forces storm Islamabad's Red Mosque to crush Taliban-style movement, killing scores. Chaudhry reinstated by Supreme Court
