Theodore Roosevelt

Became youngest president, aged 42, after assassination of William McKinley in 1901



John F. Kennedy

At 43, JFK was youngest man to be elected president. He was also youngest to die in office



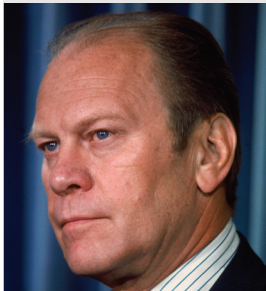
Barack Obama

Would be fifth youngest, aged 47, after Roosevelt, JFK, Bill Clinton and Ulysses S. Grant



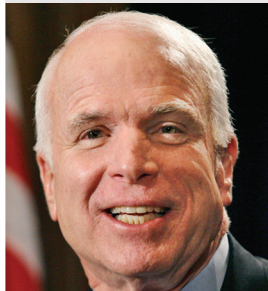
Ronald Reagan

America's oldest elected president at 69, he was nearly 80 when his term of office ended in 1989



Gerald Ford

Died in 2006 at age 93, having lived longer than any other U.S. president, just outliving Reagan



John McCain

72-year-old Republican nominee would be oldest man ever to assume the presidency
