1 Nov 4, U.S.: Will America elect its first black president? Democrat candidate **Barack Obama** is poised to make history if he defeats Republican **John McCain** when the race to the White House reaches the finishing line



2 Nov 15, Washington: World leaders will look at ways of reforming the global financial system at a crisis summit as the worst economic downturn since the **Great Depression** continues to batter markets and consumer confidence



and **Hamas**-run Gaza that has blocked efforts to found a Palestinian state

4 Mid Nov, Vienna: Oil refiners in Europe and Asia will learn how big the cuts will be in crude supplies from Saudi Arabia and other **OPEC** members for December



5 November 17-24, Marrakesh: Conservation groups will call for tough new rules on tuna fishing at a meeting of the **Commission for the Conservation of Atlantic Tuna**. The huge Mediterranean bluefin faces extinction without drastic measures



7 Nov 18, Geneva: Post-war talks between Russia and Georgia over the latter's Moscow-backed breakaway regions are due to resume after breaking down in October

8 November, Caribbean Sea: A fleet of Russian warships, led by the nuclear-powered cruiser **Pyotr Veliky** (below), will take part in joint exercises with U.S. foe Venezuela. The latest show of strength by Moscow will be the closest yet to U.S. shores



6 Nov 2, Sao Paulo: 23-year-old British driver Lewis Hamilton requires only a top five finish to become Formula One's youngest champion at the grand prix finale in Brazil
