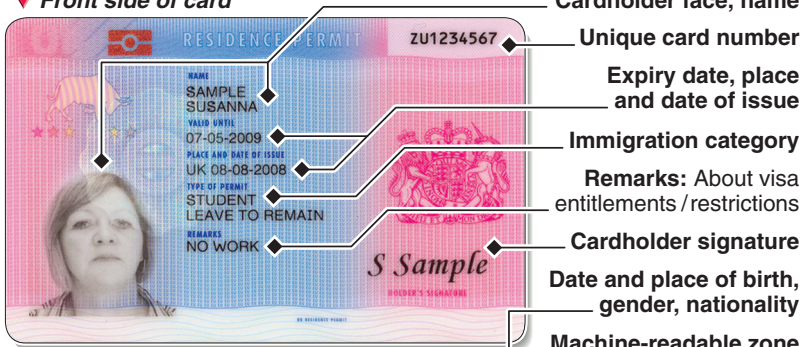


What to expect from Britain's ID card scheme

The UK government's introduction of compulsory identity cards for some foreign nationals is the first step in a controversial nationwide scheme aimed at tackling illegal immigration, terrorism and identity fraud

WHO WILL GET THE CARD

► **From Nov 25, 2008:** Non-EEA* foreign nationals who apply to enter/stay in UK as students or on marriage visa

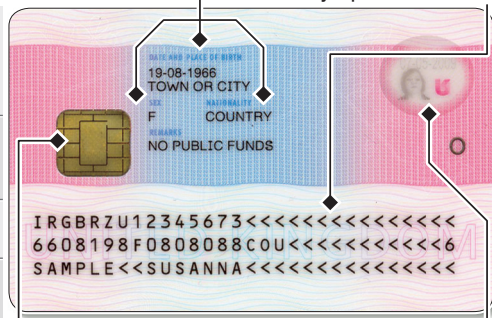
▶ **Within three years:** All non-EEA foreign nationals applying to enter/stay in UK

► **2009:** Workers in high-risk areas such as airports

► **2010:** Voluntary – firstly for young people to aid proof of identity – then for all ages

► **2011/12:** People applying for new biometric passport will be registered on scheme
