India and Pakistan timeline of tensions

- 1947: Muslim Pakistan formed from partition of India at end of British rule, amid bloodletting between Hindus and Muslims
- 1947-48: The two countries fight their first war over Kashmir after its Hindu ruler opts to join secular India rather than Islamic Pakistan
- 1965: Second war over Kashmir. War ends after UN calls ceasefire
- 1971: Pakistan and India go to war a third time, over East Pakistan, which becomes independent Bangladesh
- 1974: India detonates its first nuclear device

against crackdown on separatism,

- 1990: Indian army kills 38 people in Kashmiri city of Srinagar, during protest
- spurring insurgency that kills 40,000 people over next 14 years. India says Pakistan arms and trains guerrillas. Islamabad denies charge
- 1998: India holds 5 underground nuclear tests near Pakistan border. Pakistan responds with 6 tests
- 2001, Dec: Gunmen attack Indian parliament. India blames Pakistanbased Kashmiri militants
- 2003, Nov: Pakistan announces ceasefire in Kashmir. Truce takes effect

■ 2002, Jan: Thousands of soldiers confront each other on border

- 2004: The two countries launch peace process that brings improvement in diplomatic links
- 2006, Jul: Bomb blasts in Mumbai kill over 180 people. Peace talks cancelled after Indian government blames Pakistan-based militants
- Sep: Indian Prime Minister

 Manmohan Singh and Pakistan

 President Pervez Musharraf agree

 to resume dialogue
- 2008, Nov 26: Attackers launch wave of gun and grenade assaults on Mumbai landmarks, killing at least 172 people
