

# Emergency flights to pick up stranded tourists

Relief flights are being mounted to evacuate more than 100,000 people stranded in Thailand following week-long anti-government protests at Bangkok's Suvarnabhumi international and Don Mueang airports



■ **Utapao.** Military airbase can manage about 40 relief flights per day.

**Malaysia Airlines:** Three flights to Kuala Lumpur.

**Singapore Airlines:** Two flights a day until Wednesday.

**Etihad Airways:** Boeing 777 to Abu Dhabi. Flights planned by **Japan Airlines** and **All Nippon Airways.**

**Spain:** Two military transport plus charter aircraft to evacuate 300 nationals.

**France:** Military transport to return stranded nationals.

**China:** Five flights to fly 2,800 Chinese tourists home

■ **Phuket:** Two flights to Kuala Lumpur by **Malaysia Airlines.** Two **Dragonair** Airbus A330s to Hong Kong. **Air France-KLM:** Flight to Amsterdam and Paris.

**Qantas:** Two flights to Singapore. **Jetstar:** Flights to Melbourne and Sydney

■ **Chiang Mai:** **Philippine Airlines** and **Cebu Pacific** sending flights to evacuate 427 Filipino workers
