President Obama's first day in office

As soon as Barack Obama is sworn in 20 senior officials will begin work on items at the top of his agenda – pulling the nation out of recession, directing the military to exit Iraq, and shutting down Guantanamo Bay

■ Economic crisis: Tighten regulation of remaining \$350 billion of Bush administration's \$700bn Troubled Asset Relief Programme (TARP) meant to clean out bad assets from financial system. Initiate record \$825bn fiscal stimulus plan to iolt economy into life and protect or create 3.5 million jobs Iraq: Give Joint Chiefs of Staff 16-month timetable to end war and redeploy troops to U.S. offensive against Taliban in Afghanistan. 140,000-plus U.S. troops are tied down in Iraq at cost of \$12bn a month

Issue executive order calling for closing of U.S. military prison in Cuba. Executive orders do not have to go through Congress

Other executive orders to reverse or change policies of President Bush: Revoke limitations on human stem cell research. Overturn so-called Mexico City policy, which forbids U.S. funding for family planning programmes that offer abortion. Allow California to set tougher emission standards for cars
