

Iran – 30 years after the Islamic revolution

■ **1979, Jan:** U.S.-backed Shah of Iran forced into exile after mounting discontent with his authoritarian rule

■ **Feb:** Shiite Islamic religious leader **Ayatollah Khomeini** returns from 14 years in exile, taking effective power

■ **Nov:** Islamic militants demanding extradition of Shah from New York hold 52 Americans hostage for 444 days in U.S. Embassy in Tehran

■ **1980:** Start of eight-year war with Iraq which claims lives of over one million people

■ **1988:** 290 people killed when **Iran Air** Airbus mistakenly shot down by **USS Vincennes**

■ **1989:** Khomeini dies. **Ayatollah Ali Khamenei** appointed new Supreme Leader

■ **1997:** Reformist **Mohammad Khatami** wins presidential election

■ **1999:** Student unrest turns violent over closure of pro-reform newspaper

■ **2002:** U.S. President **George Bush** describes Iran as part of an “axis of evil”

■ **2003:** Iran says it is suspending its uranium enrichment programme

■ **2004, Feb:** Conservatives win parliamentary poll after hardliners bar some 2,500 reformist candidates

■ **Jun:** Iran is rebuked by UN for failing to fully cooperate with inquiry into its nuclear activities. Tehran repeatedly reneges on commitments in subsequent years

■ **2005:** Tehran’s ultra-conservative mayor **Mahmoud Ahmadinejad** wins presidential polls, defeating former president **Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani**

■ **2007, Mar:** Diplomatic stand-off with Britain after Iran detains 15 British sailors and marines

■ **May:** UN says Iran could develop a nuclear weapon in three to eight years

■ **Dec:** New U.S. intelligence report plays down perceived nuclear threat posed by Iran

■ **2008, Jul:** Iran test-fires new version of **Shahab-3** long-range missile

■ **Aug:** Informal deadline set by West for Iran to respond to package of incentives in return for halt in nuclear activities passes without reply

■ **Nov:** In unprecedented move, President Ahmadinejad congratulates U.S. president-elect **Barack Obama** on his election victory

■ **Feb 1, 2009:** Iranians celebrate 30th anniversary of revolution
