▲ 1746: Spanish painter Francisco Jose de Gova v Lucientes was born

1135: Moses Maimonides, the foremost intellectual figure of medieval Judaism, was born in Cordoba, Spain

1870: The Fifteenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution was ratified, stating that race was no bar to voting rights

1917: Russia's provisional government accepted the idea of an independent Poland

1980: In El Salvador, 20 people were shot dead by government troops during the funeral of murdered radical Archbishop Oscar Romero
