

Cambodia's "Killing Fields" leaders on trial



The long-awaited UN-backed trial of former *Khmer Rouge* leaders is finally underway in Phnom Penh, 30 years after the fall of the murderous regime blamed for the deaths of 1.7 million Cambodians

◀ **Kaing Guek Eav, aka Comrade Duch, 66**

First on trial, boss of Khmer Rouge's *Tuol Sleng* prison is accused of presiding over torture and execution of 16,000 men, women and children from 1975-79

OTHER SUSPECTS – trials scheduled to start in 2010



Nuon Chea, 82

Also known as "Brother Number Two", was deputy to Khmer Rouge founder *Pol Pot*



Ieng Sary, 83

"Brother Number Three" – Khmer Rouge's foreign minister, arrested in 2007



Ieng Thirith, 76

Ieng Sary's wife was most senior woman in regime as Minister of Social Affairs



Khieu Samphan, 77

Represented public face of regime as Khmer Rouge's official head of state



ESCAPED JUSTICE: Pol Pot died in his bed aged 72 in 1998



Ta Mok Military chief died aged 80 in hospital in 2006



Son Sen Security chief killed in 1997 on orders of Pol Pot
