ANC leader poised to become South Africa's fourth post-apartheid president

■ Jacob Gedleyihlekisa Zuma. Born April 12, 1942, Inkandla, KwaZulu-Natal province

■ Early years: Childhood spent moving between Zululand and Durban where his widowed mother works as a cleaner. Young Zuma does not receive any formal schooling

Political awakening: Zuma joins African National Congress at age of 17, becoming active in military wing, Umkhonto We Sizwe (Spear of the Nation) in 1962. Joins South African Communist Party in 1963 – the same year he is convicted of conspiring to overthrow apartheid government. He is imprisoned for 10 years on Robben Island alongside Nelson Mandela

Soviet connection: In 1974 Zuma receives military training in Soviet Union before joining the ANC's feared *iMbokodo* (the Grindstone) as Head of Intelligence

Allegations and charges: After an eight-year legal battle, 16 counts of corruption, bribery, money laundering and racketeering are dropped earlier this month. In 2006 he is aquitted on a rape charge

■ Family: Zuma, who is said to have 18 children, is a self-proclaimed polygamist, having had as many as four wives at one time. He currently has two: Sizakele Khumalo, whom he met in 1959, and Nompumelelo Ntuli Zuma, whom he married last year
