Role of the Speaker



- elect Speaker who controls proceedings of House of Commons, chairs debates, keeps order and calls on MPs to speak
- Speaker required to be impartial referee. When elected, Speaker resigns from his or her party
- Position dates back to 1377
- Speaker is highest commoner in land, representing House of Commons' independence in dealing with monarchy
- Speaker is responsible for running Fees Office which is at heart of MPs' expenses scandal
- During reign of Henry VIII three Speakers were beheaded
- Only Speaker to be forcibly stripped of his role was Sir John Trevor who was expelled in 1695 for accepting a bribe
- Speaker receives £141,866 salary
