A True Great:

Sampras makes history by powering his way to a seventh Wimbledon title - his fourth in a row – setting new world record of 13 Grand Slam wins



Goran Ivanisevic CRO bt Pat Rafter AUS

6-3, 3-6, 6-3, 2-6, 9-7 Wild-card Winner:

Ivanisevic's fourth attempt at a Wimbledon title – after an enthralling contest, the Croat becomes the first wild-card entry to win the tournament



2002 Llevton Hewitt AUS bt **David Nalbandian** ARG 6-1, 6-3, 6-2

One-sided Brilliance: Top seed Hewitt dispatches the unseeded Nalbandian in a dominant display of fast feet and baseline power to clinch his first Wimbledon title



Roger Federer SUI bt Mark Philippoussis AUS 7-6, 6-2, 7-6

Federer's First:

Number four seed Federer, undefeated on grass in 2003, secures his first Grand Slam title with a straight sets demolition of Philippoussis



2004 Roger Federer SUI bt Andy Roddick USA 4-6, 7-5, 7-6, 6-4

Federer Fights Back:


Having won the Australian Open earlier in the year, Federer seals his third Grand Slam title with a battling victory over Roddick

New Centre Court King:

Nadal wins his first Wimbledon title in a thrilling five-set spectacle lasting 4 hrs 48 mins - the longest men's singles final in Wimbledon history
