ELECTED INSTITUTIONS

PRESIDENT: Mahmoud Ahmadinejad

Heads executive branch of power, elected for four years, can serve maximum of two terms.

Ensures constitution is implemented

UNELECTED INSTITUTIONS

SUPREME LEADER: Ayatollah Ali Khamenei Appointed for life, has final word on all matters of state, including confirmation of president's election. Succeeded Ayatollah Khomeini in 1989



ARMED FORCES
Includes Revolutionary
Guard, headed by
Mohammad Ali Jafari,
and regular forces under
joint general command



HEAD OF JUDICIARY Ensures Islamic law is enforced and defines legal policy. Currently Ayatollah Mahmoud Hashemi Shahrudi



EXPEDIENCY COUNCIL Legislates in disputes between parliament and Guardian Council. Current Secretary is Mohsen Rezai



Can bar candidates from standing in elections to presidency, parliament or Assembly of Experts



COUNCIL OF GUARDIANS

Influential body of 12 clerics, consisting of six theologians appointed by Supreme Leader and six jurists nominated by judiciary and approved by parliament. Has power to veto parliament if legislation deemed to conflict with Islamic law. Headed by **Ayatollah Ahmad Jannati**
