

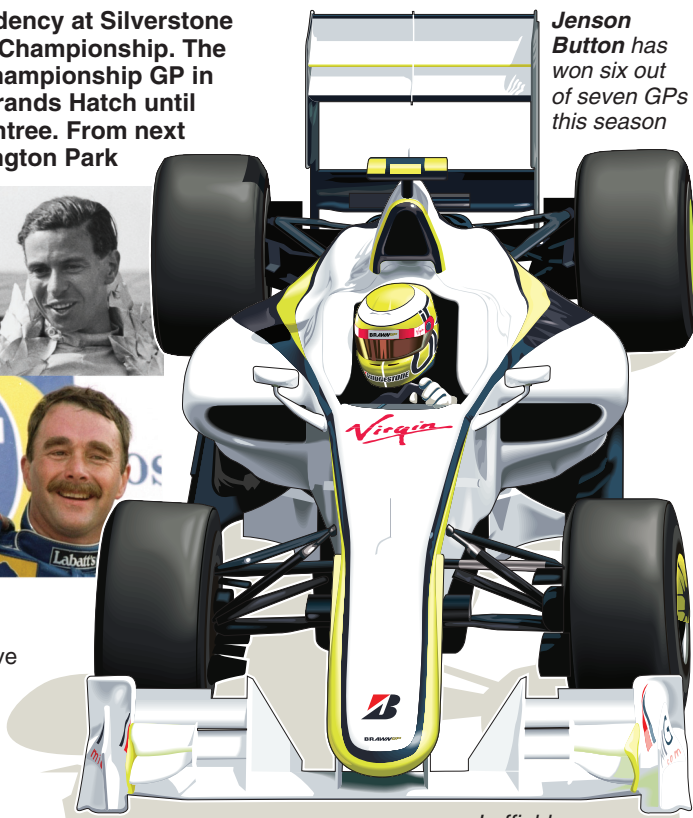
Grand Prix circus bids farewell to Silverstone

The British Grand Prix ends its 22-year residency at Silverstone with a British driver once again leading the Championship. The circuit, which hosted the very first World Championship GP in 1950, alternated between Silverstone and Brands Hatch until 1987, with several early GPs also held at Aintree. From next year the race is scheduled to move to Donington Park

CHANGING FACE OF THE CIRCUIT

1950	First F1 race on site of former airfield
1952	Pit lane and starting grid moved
1975	Woodcote chicane to reduce speed at corner
1987	Bridge chicane to reduce speed at Woodcote
1991	Major remodelling includes Becketts, Vale, Priory and Luffield corners
1994	Abbey chicane introduced
2000	Luffield reduced to single corner
