The Open: Turnberry hole-by-hole

1 Ailsa Craig

The first hole is named after the Ailsa Rock in the Firth of Forth, visible from almost anywhere on the coastal Ayrshire course
354 yds



2 Mak Siccar

"Make sure" to avoid the numerous fairway bunkers
428 yds



3 Blaw Wearie

Plays against the prevailing wind
489 yds



5 Fin Me Oot

Tricky fairway bunkers soon "find out" any weaknesses
474 yds



4 Woe-Be-Tide

Beware the rising waters of the Firth on the first of the shoreline holes
166 yds



6 Tappie Toorie

Toorie means the top – a long uphill ends at the high green
231 yds



7 Roon the Ben

A dog-leg takes the player round a rise on the only par-5 in the front nine holes
538 yds



8 Goat Fell

Named after the peak on the Isle of Arran towards which this hole points
454 yds



9 Bruce's Castle

Remains of the castle of Robert the Bruce can be seen from the green

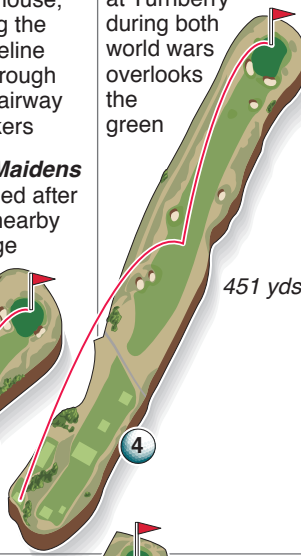
10 Dinna Fouter

"Don't falter" at the dramatic tee by the lighthouse, along the shoreline or through the fairway bunkers

12 Monument

A memorial to lost airmen stationed at Turnberry during both world wars overlooks the green

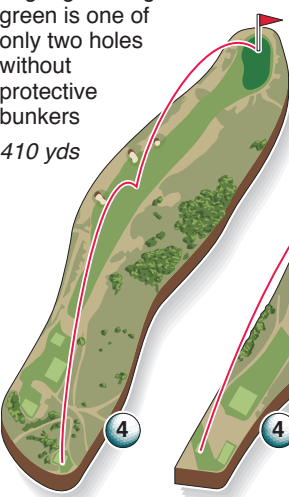
11 Maidens

Named after the nearby village
175 yds



13 Ticky Tap

A tricky stroke is required for this dog-leg although the green is one of only two holes without protective bunkers

14 Risk-an-Hope

Two new fairway bunkers make this hole riskier than ever

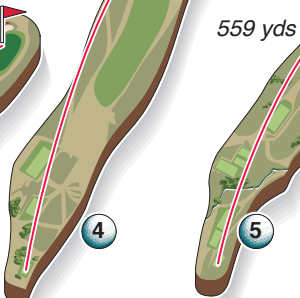
16 Wee Burn

The stream known as Wilson's Burn protects the green

15 Ca' Canny

"Take care" on this punishing and unforgiving hole

17 Lang Whang

Requires a long drive to reach the green

18 Duel in the Sun

Named after the historic 1977 showdown between **Tom Watson** and **Jack Nicklaus**
