1999 Paul Lawrie SCO 290 (+6) AFTER PLAY-OFF Carnoustie

(1) Local Winner:

Aberdeen-born Paul Lawrie seals the Championship with a birdie on the 18th hole after a tense 3-way play-off with Leonard and Van de Velde



2000 Tiger Woods USA 269 (-19) St Andrews

1 Terrific Tiger:

A superb Woods secures an eight stroke victory over Els and Bjorn - shooting all four rounds under 70 - only the third Open champion to do so



2001 David Duval USA 274 (-10) Royal Lytham and St Annes

Duval's Delight:

A brilliant last round of four under – together with rounds of 69 and 65 - leads an inspired Duval to claim the Claret Jug at the 130th Open



2002 Ernie Els RSA 278 (-6) AFTER PLAY-OFF Muirfield

Play-off Thriller:

Els, Levet, Elkington and Appleby contest the first ever four-man play-off - Els seals a sudden death victory over Levet with a 4ft uphill putt



2003 Ben Curtis USA 283 (-1) Royal St George

Debut Champion:

A consistent Curtis holds off Woods, Singh, and most notably, Bjorn, to become the first first-time Open winner since Tom Watson in 1975



2004 **Todd Hamilton USA** 274 (-10) AFTER PLAY-OFF Royal Troon

Major Surprise:

Partnered up for the final round. Hamilton and Els contest a tense battle for the Claret Jug, the American sealing victory with a 2ft putt



2005 Tiger Woods USA 274 (-14) St Andrews

End of an Era:

Supreme Woods leads from start to finish - somewhat overshadowed by three-time winner Jack Nicklaus making his final Open appearance



Tiger Woods USA 270 (-18) Royal Liverpool

Three Woods:

Leading from the 2nd round. Woods holds off challenges from Els, Di Marco and Furyk to clinch a hat-trick of Open titles - his 11th Major success



2007 Padraig Harrington IRE **277 (-7)** AFTER PLAY-OFF Carnoustie

European Euphoria: Leading Garcia by one shot

going up the 18th, Harrington hits a six on the last, sending the Open into a play-off - the Irishman holds his nerve to win



2008 Padraig Harrington IRE 283 (+3) Royal Birkdale

(1) Irish Double:

Harrington becomes the 16th player to successfully defend his Open title, sealing a fourshot victory with a 3ft eagle putt on the 17th hole
