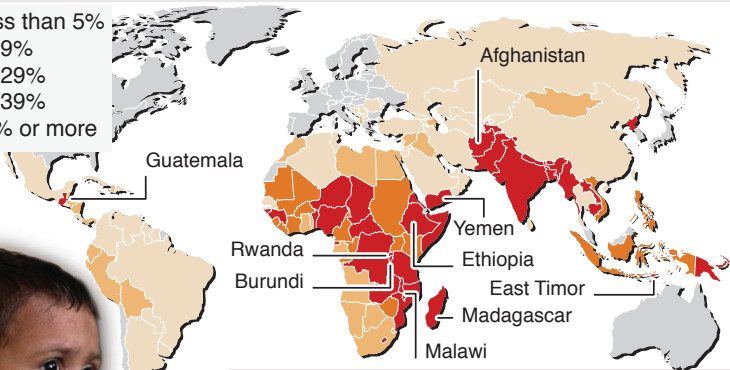
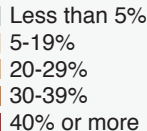


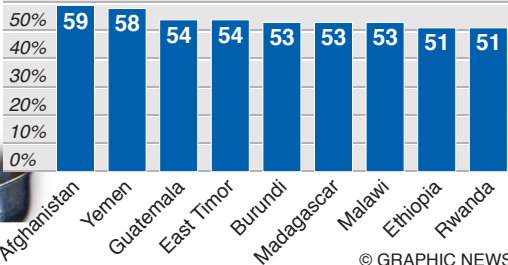
# Poor nutrition stunts growth of 200m children

Nearly 200 million children under five in developing countries suffer from stunted growth and health problems due to poor nutrition. Over 90 percent of those children live in Africa and Asia, and more than a third of all deaths in that age group are linked to undernutrition
