

World's most wanted surviving Nazi suspects

John Demjanjuk tops the list of 10 most-wanted Nazi war criminals compiled by the Simon Wiesenthal Centre. They are sought because they have not been punished, even if they have been tried



1 John Demjanjuk (b.1920): Born in Ukraine. Extradited to Germany from U.S. in May 2009. On trial in Munich, faces charges of helping to murder over 27,000 Jews at Sobibor death camp in Poland



2 Sandor Kepiro (b.1914): Former Hungarian police officer accused of murdering up to 2,000 civilians in Serbia. Convicted in Hungary in 1944 but never jailed. Hungary reinvestigating case



3 Milivoj Asner (b. 1913): Former Croatian police chief, accused of role in deporting hundreds to death camps. Croatia's extradition request refused by Austria on medical grounds

4 Soeren Kam (b.1921): Danish-born, served in SS. Accused of murdering anti-Nazi journalist. Arrested in Germany in 2006 – extradition to Denmark delayed

5 Klaas Carl Faber (b.1922): Sentenced to life imprisonment in Holland in 1948 for murder of prisoners in 1944. Escaped to Germany in 1952



6 Heinrich Boere (b.1921): Former member of SS hit squad accused of murdering three Dutch civilians. Sentenced to death in absentia in Holland in 1949. Now on trial in Aachen, Germany



7 Karoly Zentai (b.1921): Accused of participating in persecution and murder of Jews in Hungary. Appealing against extradition from Australia

8 Mikhail Gorshkow (b.1923): Alleged Gestapo interrogator, accused of helping kill some 3,000 Jews in Belarus. U.S. citizenship revoked in 2002, under investigation in Estonia

9 Algimantas Dailide (b.1921): Deported from U.S. Convicted in Lithuania for arresting Jews later murdered by Nazi collaborators. Jail sentence suspended due to ill health

10 Harry Mannil (b.1921): Accused of arresting Jews and Communists later murdered by Nazis while serving with Estonian police. Cleared by Estonian investigators but barred from entry to U.S. Lives in Venezuela

Alois Brunner and Aribert Heim thought likely to be dead but remain on list until their deaths are proven
