

E-mails stolen from computer servers of the University of East Anglia's Climate Research Unit (CRU) and posted worldwide on the internet show climate researchers discussed keeping some scientific papers out of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change's 2007 report which formed the basis for UN-led climate-treaty talks



Keith Briffa: Colleague of Dr Jones at CRU is put in charge of finding evidence to support post-1960 temperature rises. In original article in Nature in 1998, Dr Briffa and colleagues stress that post-1960 data in

their tree-ring dataset should not be used in reconstructing temperatures due to *decline* in tree ring widths - which indicates decline in

temperatures. Critics claim Briffa later uses data from single tree in Siberia's Yamal peninsula to support hockey graph

The critics: In 2003. Canadians Steve McIntvre (left) and Ross McKitrick co-author paper questioning validity of hockey stick graph. Report slammed by IPCC scientists

Wegman report: Commissioned by U.S. Congress in 2006, concludes hockey stick is dominated by tree ring samples which suppress Medieval Warm Period and exaggerate late 20th-century temperatures. Report backs criticisms by McIntyre and McKitrick as "valid and compelling"

Royal Society: Insists CRU discloses raw data, requested by McIntyre under freedom of information laws. McIntyre dubs Briffa's tree - YAD061, on Yadayakhodyyakha River - "the most influential tree in the world"



Philip Jones: Director of CRU. Professor Jones is in charge of most important of four sets of data used by IPCC. Has stepped down pending investigation into allegations that he e-mailed instructions to colleagues to "hide the decline" in post-1960 temperatures which appears in some climate data, but is contradicted by other evidence which shows temperatures rising
