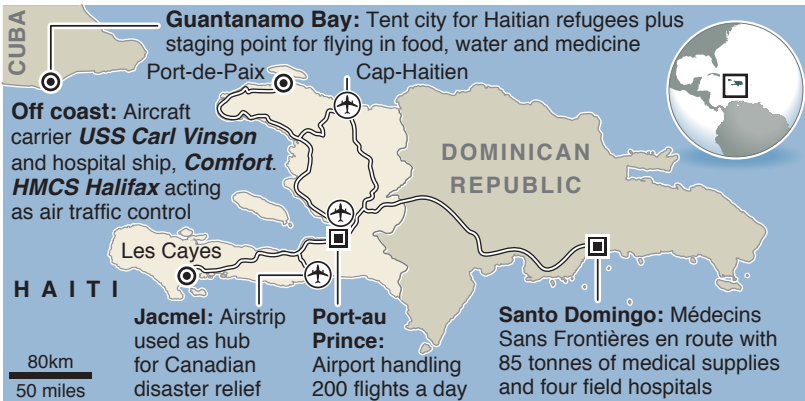


Distribution hampers Haiti relief effort

The United States is sending more than 4,000 additional troops to quake-devastated Haiti to speed up the delivery of much needed help. Port clearance ships are also en route in a bid to re-open Port-au-Prince's badly damaged dock as soon as possible
