
Final act of Michael Jackson drama

Michael Jackson's personal doctor, Conrad Murray, accused of giving the singer a fatal dose of anaesthetics and sedatives, pleaded not quilty to a single charge of involuntary manslaughter



as he prepared for strenuous series of comeback performances. Michael Jackson, 50, died at his The charge: That Murray did

unlawfully, and without malice, kill Michael Joseph Jackson by acting without due caution and circumspection.

If convicted, Murray could face up to four years in prison

Drugs found during autopsy: Propofol - used to sedate patients before surgery. Known as milk of amnesia because patient cannot remember procedure

Lorazepam, Diazepam benzodiazepines, drugs used to treat anxiety and insomnia

Midazolam - sedative similar to propofol

Lidocaine - local anaesthetic Ephedrine - stimulant
