- Economy: Spending cuts rather than tax hikes to reduce forecast £167 billion budget deficit. No area of public spending to be protected. Scrap replacement for Trident nuclear submarines, cancel Eurofighter Typhoon jet. Reform generous public sector pensions
- Taxes: Cut tax relief and loopholes to richest. Raise personal allowance from £6,475 to £10,000 this will cut £700 from average tax bill
- Banking sector: Separate retail and investment banking divisions to create greater competition. Banks seen as "too big to fail" to pay supplementary tax on profits. High bonuses to be restricted

- Afghanistan: Continue to support military involvement in Helmand as long as troops are properly equipped and operating as part of co-ordinated international plan
- Social issues: Boost primary school education, reduce class sizes. Funds to help children from poorest families. Phase out student fees. Scrap National Identity card scheme, remove innocent people's data from national DNA database
 - Electoral reform: Cut size of parliament from 650 to 500 MPs.

 Introduce single transferable vote to replace first-past-the-post system
- International aid: Boost spending from current 0.56% to 0.7% of GDP
