

Commitments pledged at U.S. nuclear summit

The U.S and Russia have each agreed to dispose of 34 tonnes of surplus weapons-grade plutonium – enough for 17,000 warheads – as part of a global drive to secure all vulnerable nuclear material within four years and prevent material falling into the hands of terrorists

U.S.: Will convert six remaining highly enriched uranium-fuelled (HEU) reactors to use low enriched uranium (LEU) fuel

CANADA: To return spent nuclear fuel to U.S. – its supplier – by 2018

RUSSIA: To spend around \$2.5bn to dispose of plutonium stocks – U.S. will contribute \$400m

To close last remaining plutonium reactor

KAZAKHSTAN: To convert research reactor and eliminate remaining HEU

NORWAY:

To contribute \$3.3m to IAEA security fund

MEXICO:

To work with U.S., Canada and IAEA to convert research reactor from use of HEU to LEU fuel

UKRAINE:

To get rid of HEU stockpile by 2012

CHILE: Removed all HEU in March 2010

VIETNAM:

To convert HEU research reactor
