

North Korean leaders. Kim II-sung (lett), 1972-94, Kim Jong-II, 1994-present

■ Jan 1967: North Korea sinks South Korean warship near disputed maritime border. Thirty-nine of 79 sailors on board are killed



■ Jan 1968: South Korea's President *Park Chung-hee* survives assassination attempt by 31 North Korean commandos

- Dec 1969: South Korean airliner hijacked to North Korea. Thirty-nine hostages freed, 12 others are never released
- Aug 1974: President Park survives assassination attempt first lady killed
- Oct 1983: South Korean President Chun Doo-hwan narrowly escapes bombing in Burma that kills 21 people
- Nov 1987: Bombing of Korean Air Flight 858 kills 115 passengers and crew. Perpetrator linked to Kim Jong-il

- Dec 1991: North and South Korea sign non-aggression pact
- Jun 1999: Patrol boats from North repeatedly cross Yellow Sea maritime border, prompting exchange of fire
- Jun 2002: Firefight sinks South Korean boat; six South Korean sailors killed during salvage operation
- Mar 2010: Explosion sinks South Korean naval ship near maritime border, killing 46 sailors. International report concludes corvette *Cheonan* was sunk by North Korean torpedo
