## Top Al Qaeda leader believed killed

Sheikh Sa'id al-Masri, Al Qaeda's third-in-command whose role spanned from operations to fundraising, is believed to have been killed in May by a CIA missile strike in the tribal areas of Pakistan



Sheikh Sa'id al-Masri: Also known as Mustafa Abu al-Yazid. was Al Qaeda's No. 3 after Osama bin Laden and Avman al-Zawahiri. Egyptian-born al-Masri, 55, is believed to have controlled secret bank accounts used to finance 9/11 attacks on New York and Washington. Close to Taliban leader Mullah Omar. Linked to assassination in 1981 of Egyptian President
