## **Cuba's political prisoners**

Cuba has agreed to free 52 political detainees in the island's largest mass liberation of prisoners of conscience in 12 years. The release follows high-profile hunger strikes and pressure from the Vatican and Spain



- 1978: Cuba's President *Fidel Castro* frees 3,600 political prisoners
- 1998: Castro releases 101 political prisoners after *Pope John Paul II's* visit to communist state
- Mar 2003: 75 opposition activists imprisoned during "Black Spring"
- 2006: Fidel Castro hands over power to his younger brother *Raul Castro*. Number of political prisoners in Cuban iails stands at 316
- 2007: Raul Castro sentences 325 opponents to short-term detention
- 2008: Number of long-term political prisoners falls to 234. Short-term detentions soar to over 1.500

- 2009: Number of long-term political prisoners falls to 205
- Feb 2010: Orlando Zapata dies after 85-day hunger strike. Guillermo Farinas begins hunger strike
  - May-Jul: Dialogue between Cuban government, Catholic church and Spain leads to announcement that 52 prisoners jailed during Black Spring will be released within four months
- Jul 12: First seven political prisoners freed by Cuba leave with their relatives for exile in Spain
