## **Australia's divisive election issues**

Australia's Labor Prime Minister Julia Gillard and centre-right rival Tony Abbott are locked in a battle to win marginal seats where voters are focused on the divisive issues of mining tax, climate and immigration



## JULIA GILLARD

- Resources Rent Tax on coal and iron ore mining profits. Tax will fund reduction in company tax from 30% to 29% for small businesses by 2012-13, and for big companies by 2014
- Deficit: Return \$40.4 billion budget deficit to surplus by 2013
- Internet: Build \$43bn fibre-optic high-speed *National Broadband Network*. NBN will give speeds up to 100 megabits per second (Mbps) to 93% of households
- Climate: Cut carbon dioxide emissions by at least 5% by 2020. "Citizens' assembly" to vet proposed *Emissions Trading*

Scheme (ETS). Boost solar power, "hot rocks" geothermal energy, and carbon capture and storage

■ People: All women to have right to take 18 weeks parental leave on minimum wage from January 2011. Cut immigration by about half by 2012

## TONY ABBOTT

- Taxes: No new mining tax. Cut company tax to 28.5% from 2013. Tax reform agenda to be unveiled within 12 months
- Deficit: Plans for \$24 billion in cuts to restore budget to surplus within three years
- Internet: Scrap NBN.
  Invest \$6bn in existing
  copper, cable and wireless
  technology to deliver
  broadband of at least
  12 Mbps to 97% of homes
  Climate: Match 5% CO<sub>2</sub>
- emissions cut by 2020, but no ETS. **\$1bn** fund to help individuals and industry cut emissions.

Plant 20 million trees to capture CO<sub>2</sub> from atmosphere. **\$1,000** solar panel rebates to 1 million homes

People: Fund 26-week parental leave scheme on mother's full pay from new 1.5% tax on business. Cut

immigration by about 40%
