

Pakistan Taliban attacks on NATO convoys

NATO's main supply route to Afghanistan remains closed as convoys continue to come under attack. Over 6,000 trucks carrying fuel, military vehicles and other non-lethal supplies are currently stranded throughout Pakistan

- 1 Shikarpur, Oct 1:** Gunmen torch at least 27 trucks and oil tankers parked in petrol station
- 2 Khuzdar, Oct 1:** Two killed in attack on oil tanker separated from convoy heading to Afghanistan
- 3 Islamabad, Oct 3:** Gunmen open fire on tankers, killing six people and setting fire to over 20 vehicles
- 4 Kalat, Oct 4:** Gunmen open fire on two trucks, torching vehicles and killing one driver
- 5 Rawat, Oct 4:** Three people killed and 27 tankers set on fire after attackers storm depot
- 6 Quetta, Oct 6:** One driver killed and up to 22 NATO tankers reported destroyed near Aktharabad bypass
