Nuclear shipment highlights waste train issue

A train carrying nuclear waste across Germany reached its destination despite being held up by the biggest anti-nuclear protests in years – a sign of growing anger at Chancellor Angela Merkel's decision to extend the lifespan of the country's 17 nuclear power plants
